# A Minute with the Mayor

As we enter the final months of summer 2016, the Village is simultaneously celebrating its past and stepping towards the future.

On September 9, 10 and 11, Bartlett Heritage Days will continue our community's yearlong birthday party, which kicked off on March 2, the official date of our municipality's incorporation 125 years ago. This year's Heritage Days festival will include several birthday themed activities, including a "Birthday Picnic in the Park" on Saturday, 9/10 from 11 to 3 p.m. There will be cake and the 144th Army Band of the Illinois National Guard will perform.

Bartlett's Police Department also was established in 1891, but even into the 1930s, '40s and '50s, it routinely operated under the direction of just one full-time officer. Special and auxiliary police were called in during festivals and parades.

But time certainly has changed our police operations. Bartlett currently has a police staff of 77, which will need to increase to continue serving and protecting our growing population. Our current police facility needs to be modernized and expanded as well. The Village Board recently approved an agreement with Williams Architects for a new police facility that can adequately meet the technology, equipment and system requirements of a modern law enforcement agency.

The concept plan for the expansion consists of building onto the northern part of the current police facility with a basement and two levels above grade. During construction, operations would be maintained in the current building. When the addition is completed, department staff would move to the new building and the older

structure would be renovated as necessary. The new building will be almost double the size of the existing 22,000 square foot building.

One thing that hasn't changed over the years is the deep appreciation we have for our police officers and staff. Residents have shown this during the past few months by sending cards, cookies and flowers to the Bartlett Police Department. We thank the police force and hope they know that they have 100 percent of our support each and everyday they are on the job.

In addition to the police facility plans, the Village is starting its review of a new plan for our downtown.

The Village received a technical assistance grant from the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) in 2015 to develop a downtown transit-oriented development plan. A steering committee of local business owners, residents, Village elected officials and staff, and representatives from the RTA and METRA was formed and worked with planning consultants on crafting this plan.

This year's Bartlett Heritage Days is the 6th annual Village-wide fall festival celebrating the community's rich history. The 2016 celebration is especially meaningful because Bartlett is observing the 125th anniversary of its incorporation.

### Birthday Themed Events

In honor of this milestone birthday, several new Heritage Days events are planned, including the "Birthday Picnic in the Park," in Bartlett Park from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, 9/10. Bring your own picnic, and the Heritage Days committee will supply the birthday cake. The 144th Army Band of the Illinois National Guard will perform.

Bartlett's 125th Scavenger Hunt for Kids, all over downtown, will be brought to you by the Chicagoland Blue Star Mothers

### Other Bartlett Heritage Days highlights:

Banbury Fair hosts the country band Ghost Ryders and a fashion show Friday night. Also, head to Banbury to see returning, popular band 7Deez on Bartlett Band Bash Saturday night. This is also the location for Kids Fest and the bingo tent run by the Bartlett Chamber of Commerce on Saturday and the Bartlett High School Booster Club on Sunday.

The old-fashioned trolley will provide hop-on, hop-off transportation around the festival area on Saturday. Catch the trolley at Village Hall on Sunday, when The Bartlett Historical Society will offer narrated tours of historic homes.

Oak Street between Oneida and the railroad tracks will be closed for a pedestrian walkway and entertainment on the street, including the Illinois Wheelmen Bicycle Demo and dancers. Buskers (street performers) are again asked to participate. A classic car show returns on Sunday.

Also returning is the craft show relocated to Bartlett Town Center on Main Street, a jewelers row along Oak and the flea market on Bartlett Avenue.

Arts in Bartlett's gallery, 215 S. Main Street, will have a special exhibit "America the Beautiful" that includes local artists' works and the winners of the VFW Auxiliary high school patriotic art contest. It will also have a "Decorate an Umbrella" art contest and children's arts and crafts.

# Fall 2016 Parkway Tree Replacement Program



Through its long-running Parkway Tree Program, the Village of Bartlett has shared the cost of planting trees with homeowners in an effort to reforest Bartlett's parkways. This program has been accelerated in recent years due to the devastation caused by the emerald ash borer infestation in Illinois. The Village continues its commitment to reforestation and diversification by offering a large number of tree species again this year.

All trees available for order are 2 inches in diameter, at a cost of \$50 per tree. Due to the fixed number of trees available, orders will be filled on a first come, first serve basis.

You are only eligible to purchase a tree if you had a tree removed from your parkway or have the space for one to be planted. Trees must be spaced 30 to 40 feet apart. Other restrictions, such as proximity to street lights, hydrants, storm sewers, etc. may occur. Final planting locations will be determined by the Village.

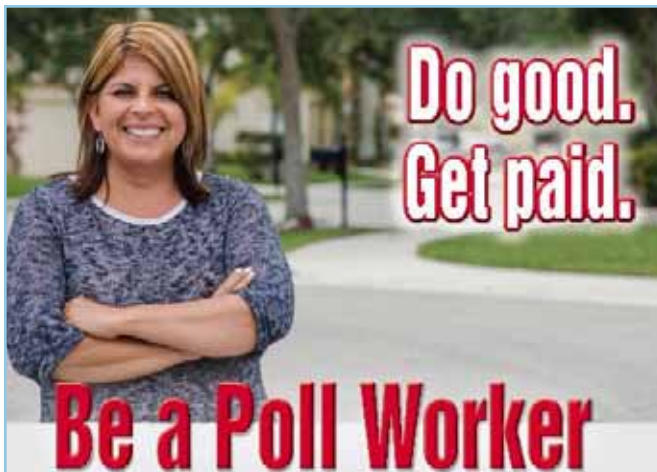

Poll workers are paid \$175 (election judge) or \$325 (equipment manager) based on the position they choose. ...School District U46 students return to school on Wednesday, 8/17. Drivers are reminded to obey school speed zone signs, refrain from using their cell phones and to pay extra attention to students walking to and from school. Please be mindful of school buses picking up and dropping off near schools and in residential neighborhoods. Congestion near schools increases during the first few weeks of the school year, so allow extra commute time.

Students who walk to and from school are encouraged to always look both ways before crossing the street, obey the school crossing guards and watch for turning vehicles. Be especially alert during inclement weather, and walk with a parent, sibling, friend or a neighbor.
