## top of the cl**A**+ss

**Bartlett High School (BHS) Project Lead the Way teacher Gary Cotie** was honored by the U-46 Board of Education for receiving the 2016 High School Teacher of the Year Award from the Technology Education Association of Illinois (TEAI). Project Lead The Way (PLTW) provides pathways in computer science, engineering and biomedical science while engaging students in hands-on activities, projects and problems.

"Mr. Cotie creates relationships with his students that maximize their abilities and is a leader in his field. Not only is he a dynamic teacher of students, he is also a teacher of teachers," said BHS Principal Mike Demovsky. "He continually seeks out new opportunities to better himself in order to stay at the top of his craft in the classroom. Bartlett High School could not be prouder."

The TEAI 2016 High School Teacher of the Year Award is an acknowledgment of an outstanding technology teacher with at least five years of teaching experience, who keeps informed of developments in technology education and uses this knowledge to constantly upgrade classroom curriculum or activities. The recipient must be active in professional organizations and maintain a positive rapport with students, faculty, administration and the industrial community.

Illinois PLTW Affiliate Director Brenda Pacey nominated Cotie, and she had many things to say about what he does both inside and outside of his classroom.

"Gary's drive to help students succeed is very evident, and students value the way he treats them professionally and encourages them to meet high standards of academic rigor, career preparation and professional demonstration of their efforts. He is also friendly, down-to-earth and always shining the spotlight on his students and colleagues," said Pacey.

Cotie has been a teacher at BHS for 15 years and was co-initiator of the high school's PLTW implementation in 2007-08. That first step at BHS led to what has become one of the state's largest district-wide high school and middle school PLTW science, technology, engineering and math curriculum implementations.

# A Minute with the Mayor

Bartlett recently had the opportunity to honor one of its most esteemed citizens, long-time civic volunteer and Village official, Trustee T.L. Arends. I was pleased to be able to join T.L., her family and her friends on October 29, when a plaque enumerating her service to the community was dedicated near the fountain in Bartlett's Town Center.



In 1979, T.L. was elected to the Bartlett Park District Board of Commissioners. She held that office for more than 10 years and served as the Park District Board president in 1986. During those same years, T.L. also found time to serve as the Bartlett Chamber of Commerce president, to sit on the Bartlett Economic Development Commission and the Bartlett Zoning Board of Appeals and to become the first female member of the Bartlett Lions Club, where she continues to don the yellow vest to this day.



In 1991, T.L. added the title of Bartlett Village Trustee to her name. It is our municipality's good fortune that she is now serving her 25th year in that role.

And how lucky are we that T.L. still had more to give. She became the first chairperson for the Bartlett 4th of July committee in 1993 and more recently, offered her time to the Bartlett Veterans Memorial Foundation and the Bartlett Rotary Club.

I can continue to list her accomplishments, but even then, I would only be scratching the surface of everything that Trustee Arends has done here in Bartlett. I can assure you, we would be hard-pressed to find a civic project or event that she has not impacted as an elected official or a dedicated volunteer.

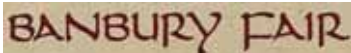

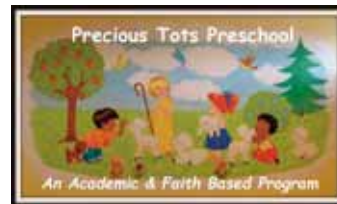

# Home Heating Safety



Heating equipment is a leading cause of home fire deaths. Half of home heating equipment fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February.

By taking a few simple steps, you can prevent most heating-related fires from happening.

- \* Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove or portable space heater.
- \* Have a three-foot “kid-free zone” around open fires and space heaters.
- \* Never use your oven to heat your home.
- \* Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central

heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer’s instructions.

- \* Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected annually by a qualified professional.
- \* Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- \* Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- \* Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- \* Test smoke alarms monthly.

## Plows are Ready!

Freezing temperatures, snow and ice are the winter norm for this area, and Bartlett Public Works salt trucks and snowplows are always ready.

Bartlett streets are plowed in the following order: main streets, secondary collector streets, cul-de-sacs and dead-end streets. Priority is given to the most heavily traveled streets.

Parking on Village streets is prohibited after 2 inches of snow has fallen to allow plows to remove snow and completely clear the street. It’s a good idea to wait until after the final pass of the plow to shovel the end of your driveway.

Please DO NOT shovel snow into the street. This can cause the formation of ice patches and can potentially result in serious accidents.

The Village clears snow from sidewalks surrounding public buildings and the commuter areas it maintains. The Village does not clear neighborhood sidewalks.

**Please be a snow angel and shovel your sidewalk** so school children and other pedestrians in your neighborhood can walk with greater ease and safety. Also, please clear snow from around fire hydrants and storm sewers. If you have any questions or concerns regarding snow removal, please call the Public Works Department, 630-837-0811.
