# A Minute with the Mayor

The great thing about summer in Bartlett is all of the festivals and events where I can see and talk to residents. The bad thing about summer is that it flies by so quickly, I don't get to hear from everyone.

Fortunately, there are lots of different options for you to communicate with me, the other elected officials and Village staff.

GORequest, the Village's citizen request management system, makes it easier than ever to contact the Village with your question or concern. It provides you with a "Virtual City Hall" that you can access via a mobile app or through the Village website, 24-hours a day, 7-days a week.

When you open the GORequest app on your smartphone or other electronic device, you can see FAQs and popular topics; report a New Issue or Track Issues that you reported previously; subscribe to eNews of your choice; quickly open the community calendar on the Village website; connect directly to Bartlett's Twitter and Facebook pages and more.

To request a service or report a concern using GORequest, simply open the app, select New Issue, take a picture if applicable, and tap submit – the phone records the GPS coordinates for an exact location and sends the request to the appropriate department and employee.

Once a request is entered into the program, GORequest will create a unique tracking number and notify you when the request has been completed.

Download the mobile app for free by searching for "GORequest" in the Apple App store or on Google Play.

If you are visiting the Village website, [www.village.bartlett.il.us](http://www.village.bartlett.il.us), and want to access the GORequest system, just click on the "Contact Us" tab on the homepage or use the "How Do I..." navigation tab and look under "Report" in the drop down menu.

The website "How Do I..." tab is also a great way to find our social media webpage and see all the different ways you can connect with the Village on Twitter and Facebook.

The Village's primary goal is to provide everyone who lives, works and does business in Bartlett with the very best customer service and a method to reach out to us that works best for you.

There are a few more festivals and events coming up in August and September. I hope to see you, and I hope the rest of your summer is filled with friends, family and lots more fun.

## Police Department's Citizen Police Academy

Bartlett Police Department will be hosting its next Citizen Police Academy on Tuesday, 9/4. The purpose of the Citizen Police Academy is to provide residents, owners or employees of a business in the Village with a better working knowledge of the police department. Participants can anticipate a fun, challenging, and educational experience, designed to foster and enhance positive relationships with the members of the department.



The Citizen Police Academy is a free, 9-week program that meets every Tuesday evening from 6 until 8 p.m. in the Bartlett Police Department's new police facility. Selected individuals participate in a series of classroom discussions, demonstrations, interactive scenarios and practical exercises.

The class size is limited. A random draw is used to select the participants if there is an overwhelming demand. Applicants must be at least 35 years old and be a Bartlett resident or an owner or employee of a business in the Village who can commit to attend the entire 9-week program.

## Back to School Safety & Bartlett High School Homecoming Parade

Wednesday, 8/15 is the first day of classes for U-46 and many other area students. Drivers are reminded to obey school speed zone signs, refrain from using their cell phones and pay extra attention to students walking to and from school.

If you're driving behind a school bus, allow a greater following distance than you would when driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing.

It is illegal to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children. If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic traveling in both directions must stop. Be alert; children often are unpredictable, so it is up to drivers to be extra vigilant.

With the return of school days come special school events. The police department will be helping to direct traffic during the Bartlett High School homecoming parade scheduled for the afternoon of Sunday, 9/23. Please check the Village website closer to the event date for more details about the time and a map of the parade route.

## Traffic Alert - Lions Day Dash

The 14th annual Bartlett Lions Day Dash will kick off on Sunday, 8/26 at 8 a.m. at the Bartlett Town Center, Main Street and Railroad Avenue. The race, previously known as the Bartlett Lions Labor Day Dash, has become a neighborhood tradition, taking runners and walkers through the tree-lined streets of the Village. Funds raised are used by the Bartlett Lions for those in need in the community.

Races start and finish across from Bartlett Village Hall in the Town Center area. The 5K and 10K run begins at 8 a.m. and the Kids & Family Dash starts at approximately 9:15 a.m. Awards will be presented after the races are finished. # 50/50 Parkway Tree Replacement Program

Through its long-running Parkway Tree Program, the Village of Bartlett has planted trees with the help of homeowners in an effort to reforest and diversify Bartlett's parkways. This 50/50 shared program provides the opportunity for residents to select and purchase a parkway tree, with the Village sharing in 50 percent of the cost.



All trees available for order are 2 inches in diameter. The cost for residents per tree is \$100, which includes planting, mulching, and a one year warranty. Limited quantities of each species are available, and all orders are filled on a first-come, first serve basis. Due to the need for tree diversification in the Village, no maple trees will be planted this year.

You are only eligible to purchase a tree if you had a tree removed from your parkway or have the space for one to be planted. Planting is only done in the parkway, not on private property. Trees must be spaced 30 to 40 feet apart. Other restrictions, such as proximity to driveways, street lights, hydrants, storm sewers, etc. may occur. Final planting locations will be determined by the Village.

Public Works will begin taking orders on August 20 for the fall 2018 planting season. Visit the Public Works page on the Village website, [www.village.bartlett.il.us](http://www.village.bartlett.il.us), on or after this date to see the available tree species and photos. Orders, with checks made payable to the Village of Bartlett, must be received by September 30. ## Yarn Bomb 2018

Arts in Bartlett is asking the community to help create a unique fiber project, Yarn Bomb, that is symbolic of Bartlett's wonderfully diverse neighborhoods and celebrates how the community is knit together beautifully. It will be a temporary installation in the pocket park in downtown Bartlett, at the corner of Railroad Avenue and Main Street, during the Bartlett Heritage Days Festival, Saturday, 9/8 and Sunday, 9/9.

The installment, lead by artist Linda Kay, will feature any fiber creation you like, knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted, weaved, etc. Volunteers will meet Monday, 8/27 to Thursday, 9/6 to sew donated pieces together, and the Yarn Bomb will be installed on Friday, 9/7.



### Here is how you can participate:

**Needed** - 4-inch X 12-inch fiber creations (knit, crochet, sewn, felted, weaved pieces) that will be sewn together in long chains and placed in the park. Pieces should be colorful, symbolic of your heritage and family background; show your colors. Bring in your donations to the Arts in Bartlett Center, 215 S. Main Street, by Saturday, 8/25.

**Volunteers Please** - from Monday, 8/27 to Thursday, 9/6, volunteers will meet to sew donated fiber pieces together. On Friday, 9/7 volunteers will install Yarn Bomb 2018 in the park.

Donated pieces will be repurposed after the exhibit and created into pieces for the Arts in Bartlett holiday party fundraiser and for sale in the Art Center. # Heritage Days at Village of Bartlett Museums

Bartlett Heritage Days, Saturday, 9/8 and Sunday, 9/9, is a perfect occasion to celebrate the Village's rich history and also experience it with visits to the Bartlett History Museum, inside Village Hall, 228 S. Main Street, and the Bartlett Depot Museum, 100 W. Railroad Avenue.

## The Bartlett Depot Museum

...will be open Saturday, 9/8, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Stop in anytime for a free kids craft and to pick-up a free self-guided downtown walking tour.

The current exhibit is "Over There, Over Here! Bartlett and the Great War" The first 100 visitors will receive a color changing cup that celebrates the Illinois Bicentennial.

**World War I Walk** - 9 a.m. OR 2 p.m. Learn more about Bartlett's 19 Yanks and homefront efforts during the Great War. Walk with the museum director through the heart of old Bartlett and see where some of the soldiers worked and lived and learn about the community's support and fundraising endeavors. The walk will last about one hour. Wear comfortable shoes! Meet at the Bartlett Depot Museum 15 minutes prior to tour time.

**Kids Story Time with Zippy, an LCC K-9 Comfort Dog** - 11 a.m. Free. How did dogs serve and help in World War I? ## Did You Know?

...Bartlett residents can register to vote at the Main Office in Village Hall. In order to vote, you must:

- ~ Be a U.S. citizen
- ~ Be a resident in your election precinct for at least 30 days prior to Election Day
- ~ Be 17 years old on or before the date of the Primary Election and turn 18 on or before the date of the General Election
- ~ NOT be convicted of an offense and be in jail
- ~ NOT claim the right to vote anywhere else

### Where and how to register to vote

You must register at least 28 days prior to an election in order to vote in that election. You can register in person, online or by mail.

**In person** - When registering in person, be sure to bring two forms of identification with you, one of which must have your current address on it.

**Online** - If you have an Illinois driver's license or state ID, you may register online through the Illinois State Board of Elections website, [ova.elections.il.gov](http://ova.elections.il.gov)

**By Mail** - Download a mail-in voter registration card and/or find voting information, such as key dates, early voting, mail voting, etc. at your county clerk's website:
